

Cutting Tennis Balls

Last year I collected over 300 tennis balls, and tried cutting the tennis balls with:

1. A butcher knife
2. A sharp kitchen knife
3. A sharp x-acto knife
4. A bread knife
5. A small hacksaw
6. A drill with a large bit



Ultimately the best tool I found was a high quality **utility knife**. If you don't have one, you're welcome to borrow mine for a few days. I found that cutting 240 tennis balls (one classroom) took about three hours. You may want to ask for parent volunteers, but I would **not** let students cut the tennis balls.
